Sri Lanka Journals Online (SLJOL) provides access to Sri Lankan published research and increases worldwide knowledge of indigenous scholarship. It is a database of peer reviewed scholarly journals published in Sri Lanka, covering the full range of academic disciplines from Agriculture to Engineering, Medicine to Social Sciences.

SLJOL enables research materials and publications to become much more available within Sri Lanka and also ensures that Sri Lankan expertise is transferred abroad to much greater effect. The service is **free** to publishers and editors and also to users.

SLJOL is a member of the Journals Online (JOL) project supported by the International Network for the Availability of Scientific Publications (INASP) to maximise worldwide knowledge of 'indigenous scholarship' and South to North knowledge sharing.

The JOL project is also supported by the Public Knowledge Project (PKP), Ubiquity Press and CrossRef and is managed by the National Science Foundation of Sri Lanka since 2013.

Coverage of SLJOL

At present over 60 journals are covered by SLJOL listing 5900 full text articles.

How journals can join SLJOL

SLJOL is not a publisher, SLJOL provides a service to the journals by hosting their content online, and actively promoting the website to encourage discovery of these titles and their articles.

Journals are selected for inclusion on SLJOL using the following criteria:

- 1. They are scholarly in content, and contain original research (in addition to other content).
- 2. Their content is peer reviewed and quality controlled.
- They are able to provide all content for inclusion on SLJOL (tables of contents, abstracts and PDFs of full text) in electronic format.
- 4. They are published within Sri Lanka.

 Management of publishing strategy, business development and production operation are all run from Sri Lanka.

Access to Global Online Research in Agriculture (AGORA) is an Internet based portal launched in 2003 by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations to provide free or low cost access to scholarly literature to researchers and academics in developing countries.

AGORA = Access to Global Online Research in Agriculture









Objectives:

- To increase access to high-quality, relevant literature in agriculture.
- To improve the quality and effectiveness of education and training.

Subject Coverage:

Covers agriculture and related fields in biological, environmental and social sciences

- More than 3000 major scientific journals.
- Full-text coverage from 1997 onward in most journals.

Who can access AGORA:

Institutions in the public sector or with a not-for-profit status qualify for **free** access to the full-text articles in AGORA's online collection. To use AGORA User institutions must be registered and users must log in using institutional user name and password.

Features and facilities of AGORA

- Browse the collection, like in a current periodical roombrowse journal titles & publishers
- Explore a subject area search for journals in a specific subject area
- Find a known citation track down a citation if you have one
- Download full-text articles
- Use CAB Abstracts as a powerful tool for discovery -CAB covers about 80% of journals in AGORA

National Digitization Project of the National Science Foundation was launched in 2011 with the aim of digitizing the collective literature out put of local research. Coupled with the *National Network of Institutional Repositories project* operated across academic, research and related institutions, a window in offered to discover and explore the scholarly literature of local scholars and to have convenient online access to the complete documents. The project will thereby support and promote productive research and innovation leading to Social and Economic Development in Sri Lanka.

OBJECTIVES

- To digitize scholarly literature of Sri Lankan origin
- To set up Institutional Repositories (IR) at the institutional level.
- To ensure all research out put of local scientists are deposited in the respective Institutional Repositories.
- To operate a National Network of Institutional Repositories among Academic, Research and related Institutions.
- To provide high visibility to local research literature.
- To offer resource discovery facilities across Institutional Repositories in the national network.
- To ensure easy and quick online access to local scholarly literature.
- To preserve the local scholarly literature.

Which Institutions are eligible to join the project?

Research, academic and related institutions producing scholarly literature are eligible to participate.

What facilities will NSF offer to participating Institutions?

- Digitization of scholarly literature output of the institution.
- Set up an Institutional Repositoryes (IR) on DSpace software to accommodate all literature output of the institution
- Provide training for staff on management and administration of Institutional Repositories.
- Conversion of existing databases into DSpace databses.
- Provide Equipment and hosting facilities for Institutional Repositories.
- Provide temporary staff for data entry.
- Technical support and trouble shooting.

What are the obligations of the Participating Institutions?

- Host an Institutional Repository/Metadata database of Institutional scholarly literature.
- Provide access to the full text of documents (free/on charge /limited access).
- Provide the NSF with a copy of the complete set of the digitized files for preservation purposes

• Digitization for wider access:

National Digitization Project of the, NSF provides financial and technical support for digitization of local scholarly literature collections in academic/research institutions for the purpose of preservation and provision of online access to full text and documents.

• Network of Institutional Repositories:

NSF provides technical support to develop Digital Repositories at institutional level to form a national network. The final goal is to provide quick and convenient online access to local scholarly literature.

• National Co-operation:

At the national level the NSLRC maintains successful cooperation with other S and T institutions, universities etc. through SLSTINET (over 100 libraries)

NSLRC is the National Focul Point fir the Asia Pacific Information Network.

NSLRC Membership:

Personal & Institutional membership is offered for database and Internet searching facilities. The membership form could be downloaded from our website. Each scientist is given a 30 minutes free search session per month.

The National Science Library and Resource Centre is mandated to maintain a comprehensive unique collection of locally generated scholarly literature covering both published & unpublished.
